Dear First Church of the Resurrection,

How do you feel these days? If I'm being honest, there are many days that I feel "soul-weary." That is, though I may have physical and mental energy aplenty, my soul - the deepest part of our being - feels wearied by a seeming onslaught of bad news. Maybe you can relate.

- Yet another surge of COVID cases nationally and here in Stark county
- Wildfires, drought, and hurricanes devastating land and lives
- The social and humanitarian crisis of Afghanistan
- Divisiveness and polarization ripping friends, families, and communities apart
- Story after story of church leaders abusing power and people

All this (and more on top of it!) contributes to the weariness of our souls. This is as it should be. We were not created to live in a world of such tumult and despair.

What I find sustaining me in such a time is a reminder that none of this is a surprise to God. Allow me to share with you some words of my friend, mentor, and Bishop, Todd Hunter from his forthcoming book, *Deep Peace*.

God is not nervously pacing the golden streets of heaven, his head held in his hands, muttering, "Oh my *Self*! What am I going to do? I didn't foresee pandemics. And how was I supposed to know that partisan politics would be driven by brutal social discourse? No one up here could have predicted the rapid rise and ever-present nature of technology. Paul, see if you can set up a Zoom meeting with Bill Gates, Mark Zuckerberg, Jeff Bezos, and Elon Musk. I want to know what the H-E-double hockey sticks is going on down there!" God sees the whole of human life. He knows a thing or two about health care, marriage, immigration, race relations, education, creation care, fair elections, and just governance. He gets it. He is at peace. He is the God of peace.

If God cares for this world more deeply than we could ever imagine yet be at peace, and if we are created in his image, then it stands to reason that we too can lead lives marked by peace.

How?

Todd goes on to say, "To receive God's peace requires that we open ourselves to God's renovation of our whole heart, mind, soul, emotions, will, and spirit. His peace operates in us by the Holy Spirit and becomes part of our character, equipping us to take our place in our various areas of human endeavor."

This is at the very center of our current series, "The Good and Beautiful Life." The peace of God's kingdom isn't about living "above" turmoil. It's about leaning into a way of life founded on God's promise to heal, restore, protect, and save.

This, I am finding, is what provides supernatural strength to my wearied soul in such a time as this.

May the same be true for you and for us as a fellowship of the Holy Spirit!
